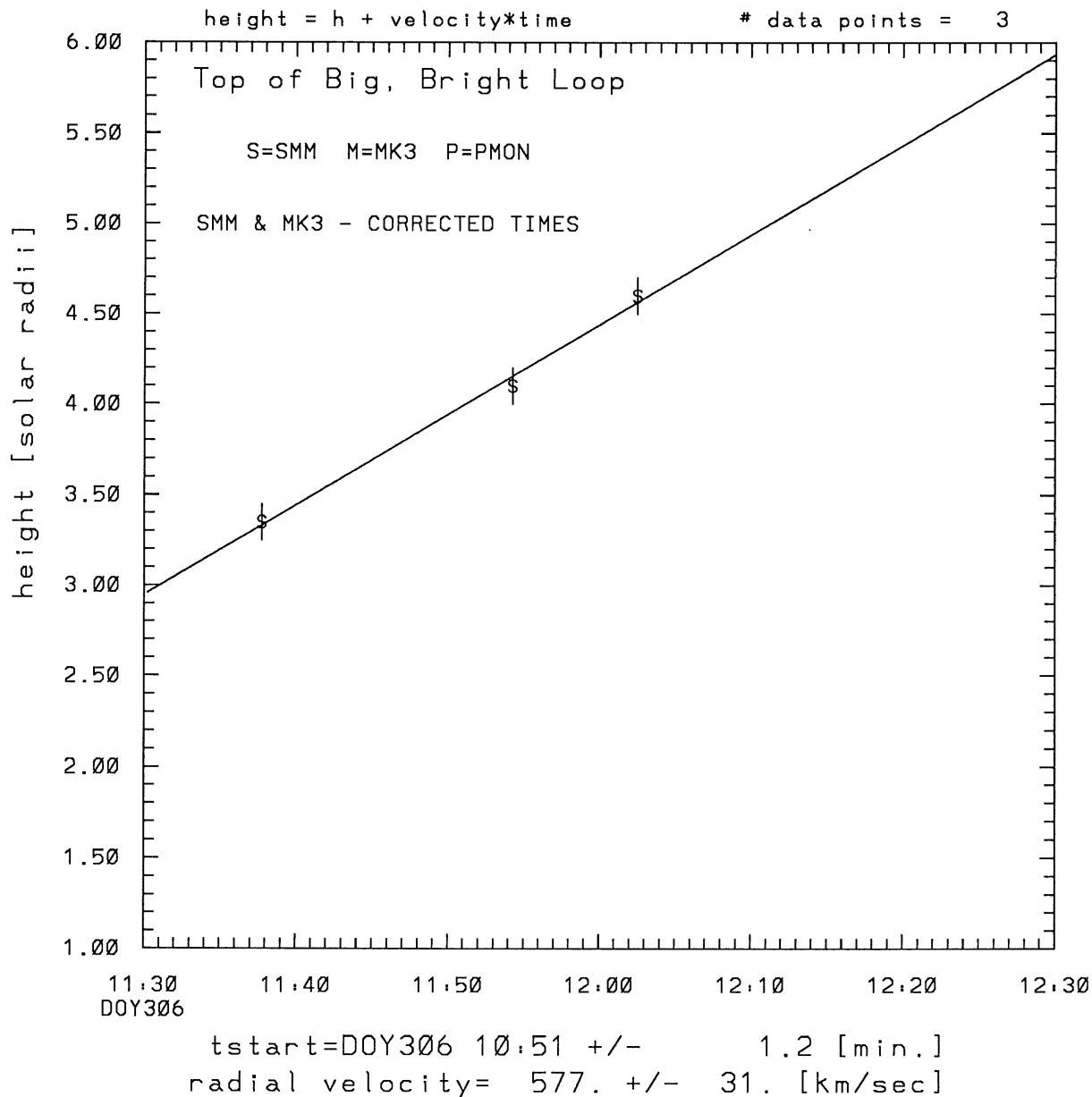
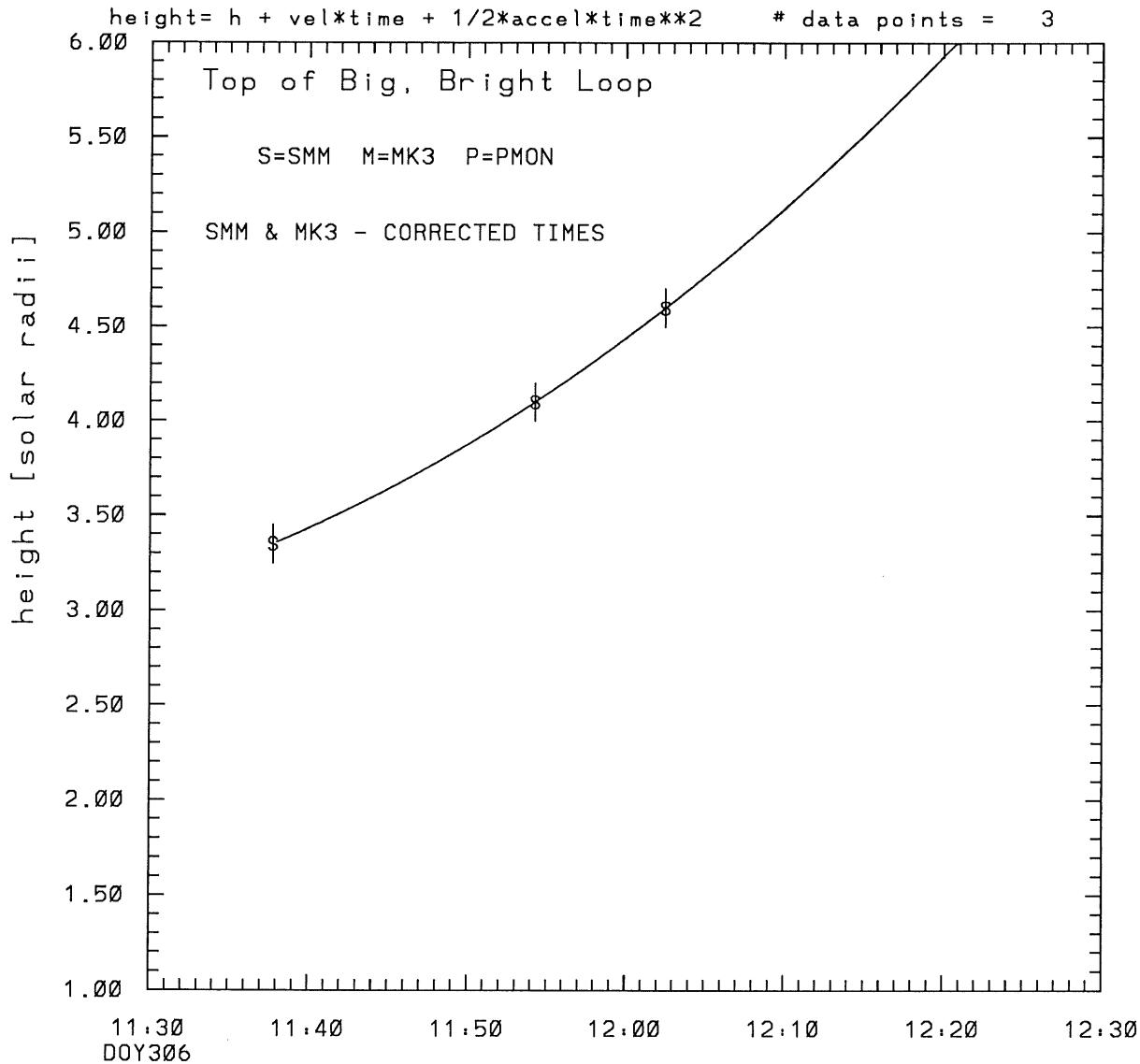

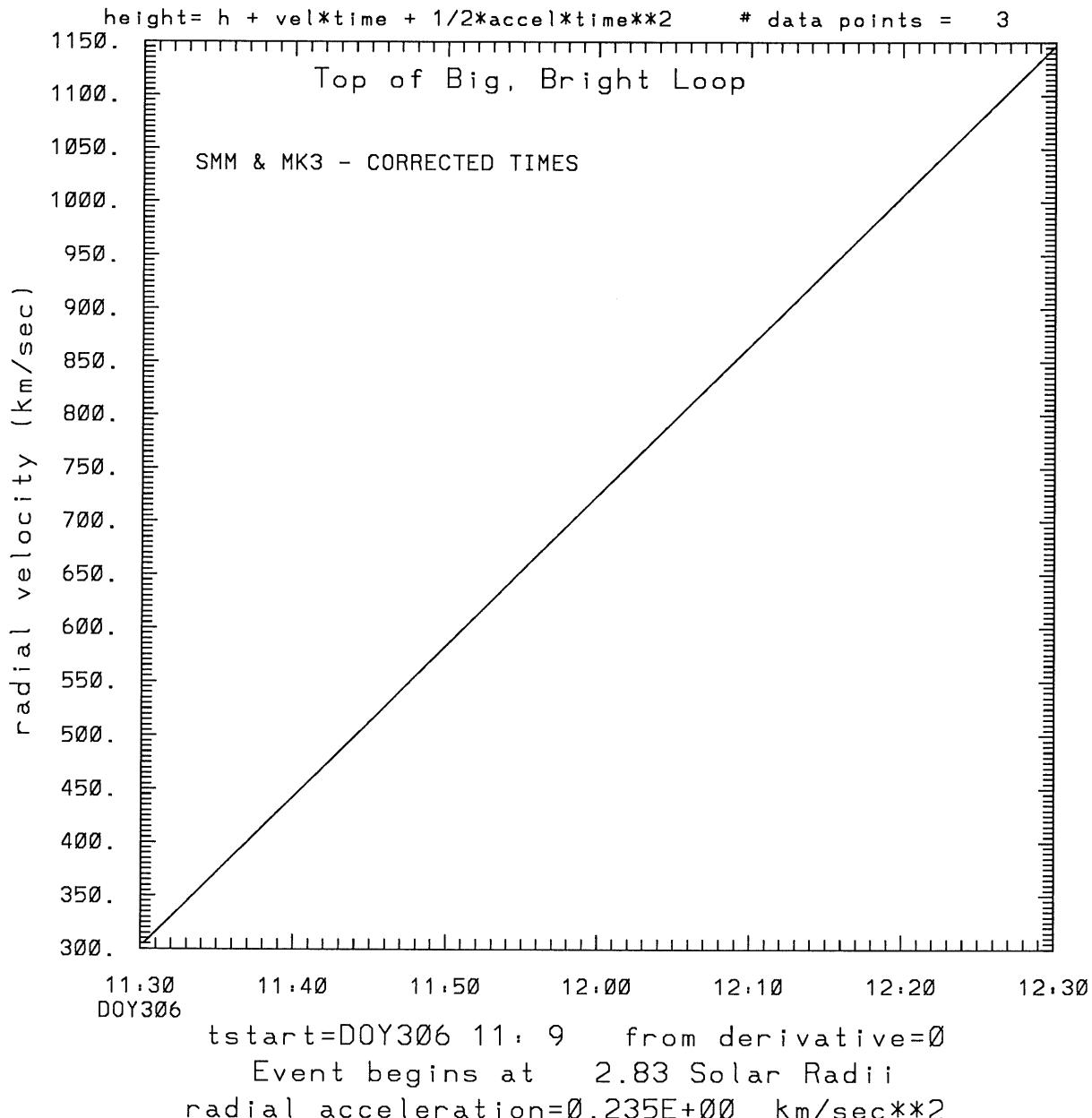


SMM C/P 1988 DOY306 60 +/- 0 degrees
